Community Plan 2017-2022



Community Building

Portage the Prairies Dirt Dash

The first annual Portage the Prairie Dirt Dash saw 150 participants take on a grueling 5 km obstacle course. Participants were challenged to run, walk, crawl, roll, and slide their way through obstacles made by local businesses and contractors. The PCRC was overwhelmed by the combined total of sponsorship via monetary and/or product donation, obstacle construction and in kind services for over \$34,000!!



Revitalize Portage! Grants

Revitalize Portage! grants allow PCRC to support great ideas in the community.

In 2016, 18 grants were distributed with a value of \$34,836.14. These grants leveraged a total of \$99,329.90 in funding, contributing to our community in many ways.

Beautification & Community Pride

To build citizen responsibility for beautification by engaging citizens, businesses & organizations in beautifying properties, greenspaces, & streets.



PCRC's Beautification Days 2016 engaged 803 community members (100 of those were youth enrolled in summer camps), helping to collect roughly 119 bags of garbage, yard waste and recycling in our community.





Graffiti Removal

Over the course of 9 weeks, the 2016 Green Team removed or covered 59 incidents of graffiti in our community - on homes, businesses, private buildings, signs, fences, and waste disposal bins. The team even painted over the Tupper Street bridge - 3 times— and BDO Centre for the Community! Our team worked closely with City of Portage by-law officers and RCMP during their employment.



Home Beautification Grants

With funding from the Province of Manitoba's Community Housing Improvement Initiative, the Home Beautification program offers grants of up to \$2,500 to eligible home owners, and



matching grants of up to \$1000 towards exterior improvements of lower cost rental units. This program is making a difference in improving neighbourhoods in Portage la Prairie.

The 2016-2017 year was a great success with \$23,964.00 in grants disbursed. In addition, homeowners contributed \$15,709.00 for a total of \$39,673 in home beautification projects. Funds were granted to 14 homeowners and 3








Affordable Recreation & Leisure
